RE: PREMARITAL HEALTH CHECK

As you may be aware, **premarital health checks are essential** for identifying potential risks and provide intervention where required. This simple yet crucial step can **significantly contribute to the well-being and happiness of couples** embarking on their life journey together.

It has however been observed that, for various reasons, quite a number of intending couples present too close (and sometimes not at all) to the marriage. Such late presentations make intervention where required very challenging or totally impossible.

In view of the above, all stakeholders are being called upon to please ensure the following:

- (1) Creation of awareness starting from early in life using sermons, counseling sessions, community gatherings, etc.
- (2) **Performance of some of the tests like** Genotype, Blood group, screening for Hepatitis, etc. for teenagers, adolescents and young adults **long before the time of marriage** to make necessary actions/interventions possible.
- (3) Use Outreaches to surrounding communities to conduct some of the tests. The University Health Service (UHS) may be contacted on 07031171702 or 07030125730 for further clarification on this.
- (4) Encourage couples to undergo health screenings before marriage. Couples should be specifically encouraged, instructed and supported to present themselves for premarital checks.

Please be assured that all required tests can be performed in the University Health Service.
