This is to inform the University community that the University has been awarded a Carnegie African Diaspora Fellowship for a project titled 'Curriculum Co-Development, Research and Mentoring of Graduate Students in Gender, International Trade Policy and Globalization'.

The 90-day project, which commences on 2 January 2014, involves Professor Mojubaolu Olufunke Okome, a Professor of Political Science at the Brooklyn College, The City University of New York, USA and Professor A.A.B. Agbaje of the Department of Political Science, Faculty of the Social Sciences.

The project strengthens the university's internationalization efforts by expanding curricular in relevant courses, exposing students and staff to varied international experience and enhancing international research collaboration.
