GENERAL REMOVAL OF HAZARDOUS TREES ON CAMPUS

The university community is hereby notified that there will be a major pruning and thinning of trees on campus. The most affected areas are the major roads on campus. It is an on-going exercise that will end towards the mid-year of 2027.

Most of the trees to be removed have been identified to pose serious threat to life and properties. The Biodiversity Management operation crews thus seek the cooperation of all stakeholders to adhere strictly to safety rules or diversion as need arises.

The affected routes are:

- (i) Oduduwa Road – SUB – Sultan Bello Hall – Faculty of Science – Faculty of the Social Sciences
- (ii) Benue Road – Sanders – Poly Gate
- (iii) Sapara Road – Faculty of Agriculture – Faculty of Veterinary Medicine
- (iv) Amina Way – Postgraduate College – Second Gate
- (v) Zoological Garden – Faculty of Technology – Queen Idia Hall – Department of Aquaculture and Fisheries Management

It is expected that new trees will be planted to replace the ones that will be removed and most bushy enclosures will be converted to wood lots that will be more beneficial to the university community.
